



Travel Procedure for the Indigenous Innovation Summit

Luminary may provide travel subsidies to approved participants from small organizations or Indigenous communities to attend the **Indigenous Innovation Summit, September 22nd- 24th in Montreal, Quebec.**

The subsidy is intended to reduce participation barriers while ensuring responsible stewardship of non-profit resources and aligning with the Treasury Board of Canada-approved rates.

Applications will be reviewed using equitable and transparent criteria, including demonstrated need, geographic barriers, participant role, community impact, and alignment with event objectives.

Travel support is limited and subject to available funding. Travel support is defined as:

- Economy class airfare/train/bus, and/or when travelling by car, a km rate for travel.
- accommodations
- meals/per diem (when not provided by the host on site at the event)
- local transit
- registration fees

Approved participants will be required to provide registration confirmation, attendance verification, receipts, and post-event reporting documentation before reimbursement.

Luminary reserves the right to coordinate travel bookings directly, establish reimbursement caps, require economical travel arrangements, or issue payments through sponsoring organizations or community partners where appropriate.

Funding may be denied, reduced, or revoked where eligibility requirements are not met or where false, incomplete, or misleading information has been provided.

Based on the number of applicants, priority may be given to Indigenous participants, community representatives, youth, Elders, Knowledge Keepers, and individuals whose participation contributes meaningfully to community engagement, leadership development, or cultural exchange.
